The Digital Communications Lead will work in collaboration with the Unsettling Dramaturgy producers, artists, and our website designer to communicate mission, programs, and events to the greater disability justice community. The Digital Communications Lead will achieve this by increasing Unsettling Dramaturgy social media presence, through engagement with the community virtually via social media and website.

We need applicants with understanding of indigenized approaches to the digital space. Priority will be given to applicants who identify as Crip, Mad, Neurodivergent, Deaf, Disabled, Chronically Ill, Black, Indigenous, Metis and/or Person of Color

### Key Responsibilities:

- Collaborate on website content to accessibly communicate programs and events
- Generate and publish consistent, dynamic content on social media platforms (Facebook, IG, Twitter), website and blog which reflect and amplify our impact
- Optimize Unsettling Dramaturgy's social media platforms and website to increase visibility and accessibility
- Build relationships with community and movement partners
- Respond to inquiries from website and social media platforms
- Create events on Facebook Live, Zoom, YouTube, IG, Twitter, etc.
- Attend Unsettling Dramaturgy public events
- In collaboration with Unsettling Dramaturgy artists, design and distribute promotional materials such as programmes and flyers

- Understanding of and commitment to anti-racist and anti-ableist principles and practices and cross-disability solidarity
- Ability to respect Indigenous Protocols as we share them
- Ability to work independently, on a team, and in collective/ collaborative settings
- Ability to recognize lack of competency and agency to seek out knowledge independently and from other practice members
- Experience working in mixed ability, multiracial, multi-gendered environments

- Prior experience in digital media and accessibility
- Basic Graphic Design and Copy Editing Skills
- Demonstrated social networking experience and social analytics tools knowledge
- Experience in and commitment to using anti-capitalist frameworks to assess media and social media
- Outstanding organizational and time management skills, including ability to set own goals/timelines and meet deadlines independently
- Superb written skills, accuracy, attention to detail, and the ability to proof own work
- Exceptional interpersonal communication skills and commitment to collaborative conflict resolution
- Proficiency with Mac systems, Word, Excel and a variety of social media platforms

## **Desired Competencies**

- 3 years of relevant social media experience for a community-based organization, non-profit, company, or professional organization.
- Proficiency writing/editing letters of intent, foundation proposals, donor letters and donor materials.
